
An organization authorized to mail at the special bulk rates may mail only its own matter at those rates. An organization may not delegate or lend the use of its permit to mail at the special bulk rates to any other person or organization.

Cooperative mailings may be made at the special bulk rates only when each of the cooperating organizations is individually authorized to mail at the special bulk rates at the post office where the mailing is deposited. Cooperative mailings involving the mailing of any matter in behalf of or produced for an organization not itself authorized to mail at the special bulk rates at the post office where the mailing is deposited must be paid at the applicable regular rate.

All matter mailed at the special bulk rates must identify the authorized permit holder. The name and return address of the authorized permit holder must appear either on the outside of the mailing piece or in a prominent location on the material being mailed. Pseudonyms or bogus names of persons or organizations may not be used. If the mailing piece bears any name and return address, it must be that of the authorized permit holder. A well recognized alternative designation or abbreviation such as "The March of Dimes" or the "AFL-CIO" may be used in place of the full name of the organization.
