By approval of the annual meeting of Latvian Foundation, Inc. and the meeting of the Board of Trustees of the above foundation, we would like to amend Article IX in our previous incorporation papers. dated September 15, 1970.

Article IX should read as follows:

This corporation is formed exclusively for literary and educational purposes within the meaning of section 501/c/3 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

Members of the Foundation shall be individuals 18 years of age or older, families the head of which is 18 years of age or older, and organizations and/or associations, and shall be admitted, subject to the approval by the Board of Trustees, upon the payment of an initiation fee which shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00) for members other than full time students at any accredited college or university and which shall be ten dollars (\$10.00) for said full time students, and upon the pledge or advance of a noninterest bearing loan or donation of at least one thousand dollars (\$1000.00) or upon the payment of a special annual assessment which has been determined prospectively at an annual meeting of the Foundation.

Upon dissolution all outstanding loans of the Foundation shall be reapid and the surplus assets remaining after payment of debts and the liquidation of all liabilities of the Foundation shall be transferred to one or more Latvian educational or literary non-profit corporations which are qualified as exempt organizations under section 501/c/3 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future

United States Internal Revenue Law).
